Sunday, April 27th, we will again be holding the Earth Day march, an event celebrated in more than 140 countries.

Earth Day marks each year the 1970 anniversary of the initiation of the environmental movement. That year the US senator Gaylord Nelson saw an occasion to encourage students to initiate projects aimed at sensitizing the population to environmental issues in their respective communities.

Earth Day has become a planetary event, mobilizing 200 million people in 141 countries and acts as a leverage towards global environmental issues such as reutilisation and recycling. It also helped prepare the grounds for the Earth Summit in 1992, in Rio de Janeiro.
